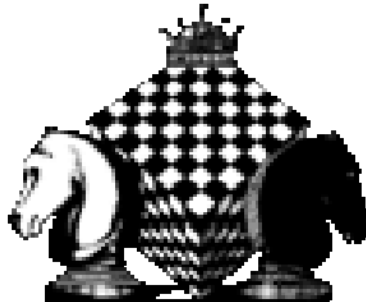




After School Activities

ISP Chess Class

September 2010 to February Break 2011



Work groups of *Noir et Blanc* aim to use chess as a means for improving the child's academic abilities.

Chess develops:

Calculation ability, concentration, analytical skills, respect, rigor, perseverance and imagination.

The Activity:

Each course is made up of two parts: About 20 minutes of theoretical teaching and 40 minutes of putting the knowledge gained into practice (individual or in pairs), according to the child's personal development. Pedagogical cards enable children to assimilate the theory.

An ongoing tournament throughout the year rewards children with trophies and medals at the end of the school year.

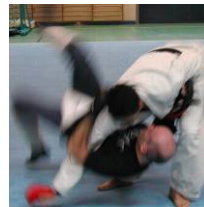

Maintenance of the Student's First Language

Research indicates that students benefit academically, socially and emotionally when they are encouraged to develop and maintain proficiency in their first language while they are learning English. Language skills and conceptual knowledge are readily transferable from one language to another, provided there are no learning exceptionalities. The first language provides a foundation for developing proficiency in additional languages, serves as a basis for emotional development, and provides a vital link with the student's family and cultural background. A strong foundation in the first language can also help students to:

- Readily reintegrate into their home country
- Develop mental flexibility
- Develop problem-solving skills
- Make connection between previous learning and new learning
- Communicate fully with a family members
- Experience a sense of cultural stability and continuity
- Understand cultural and family values
- Develop awareness of global issues
- Expand their career opportunities
