Completing the Grade 10 MYP Option Form

In order to meet the requirements of the IBMYP, and to be eligible to receive the MYP Diploma at the end of Grade 10, students must meet the following course requirements;

- a) choose one subject from groups 1 – 8; and
- b) have at least one language A program.

The school requires every student to take courses in [English](#), [French](#), [mathematics](#) and [physical education](#). Therefore, students do **not** have a choice in groups 1, 2, 5 and 8.

Elective courses

Students must choose ONE subject from each of the remaining subjects groups. In selecting each course students should choose their best subject. Grade 10 is not only the final year of the IB MYP but also a preparation year for the IB Diploma in grades 11 and 12; therefore, students should choose subjects that they may consider studying beyond Grade 10.

Group 3 (Humanities):	ONE subject from history, geography, or humanities
Group 4 (Experimental Sciences):	ONE subject from biology, physics, or chemistry
Group 6 (The Arts):	ONE subject from visual arts, music, or theatre
Group 7 (Technology):	ONE subject from computer technology or design technology
Group 9 (Option A)	This option group is primarily a language option, and the following courses are available: mother-tongue language A (a student may choose to study their own language, supported by a tutor. The school strongly encourages mother-tongue languages and will assist students in finding a tutor); Spanish A , Japanese A , Korean A , Hindi A , Spanish B Foundation , Spanish B Standard , Chinese B Foundation , Initiation au Français (for students who are beginning to learn the language), Cultures et Sociétés Françaises (for native, or near-native, French speakers), media and culture (for native, or near-native, English speakers).
Group 10 (Option B)	ONE subject from computer technology, visual arts, geography, chemistry, or Cultures et Sociétés Françaises
Group 11 (Option C)	ONE subject from physics, music, history, environmental systems & societies

English & French

The IB offers two different language programs, Language A and Language B. [Language A](#) is designed to support native (or mother tongue) speakers and is based on the study of literature; [Language B](#) is designed for students who are still learning the language and is aimed at improving language usage. The school will place each student in the appropriate class, A or B, depending on language proficiency, and this placement is under constant review.

Mathematics

The school offers two mathematics programs, Extended and Standard, and will place each student in the appropriate class depending on ability. This placement is under constant review.
