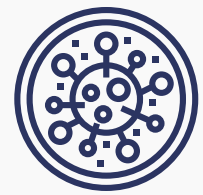




SUSPECTED/POSSIBLE COVID-19 CASE



IF AN ISP COMMUNITY MEMBER BECOMES ILL AT SCHOOL



IF AN ISP COMMUNITY MEMBER BECOMES ILL AT HOME



STEP 1

Isolate the person, in a designated room, immediately applying barrier gestures (keep a reasonable distance from the person and ensure the person has their mask on).

Staff, students, parents that are not feeling well or exhibit any symptoms of COVID-19 should **remain at home** and **do not** come to school (including for student pick-up or drop-off).

STEP 2

If there is **no sign of distress** (difficulty speaking, visible signs of oxygen deprivation – blue skin, loss of consciousness, drowsiness, confusion), the person should contact their primary physician, and arrange for their return home. Transportation for a person with symptoms of COVID-19 requires specific precautions, such as no public transportation and wearing a mask at all times.

In the case of distress, call the SAMU - Dial 15. Stay close to the person to allow the doctor to talk to them if necessary. The Samu operator will connect the doctor who will inform you what to do (often asking to speak to the person or to hear them breathing). Also, ask what to do while waiting and hang up only when you are told.

Affected person(s) contact their primary physician for evaluation, COVID-19 testing eligibility and medical advice for next steps (including potential clearance requirements to return to school, such as a medical health certificate or attestation).

STEP 3

After the person has been transported by the Samu, notify the Occupational Health Service and follow their instructions.

Students that are at home for illness have the right to access the ISP online home learning curriculum.

STEP 4

The school is informed if the individual is confirmed to have COVID-19, at which point the school will follow the **"Confirmed Positive Case"** procedures in the corresponding flowchart.



CONFIRMED POSITIVE COVID-19 CASE



A MEMBER OF THE ISP COMMUNITY TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19
THIS INCLUDES STUDENTS, STAFF, PARENTS AND ANYONE LIVING IN THE COMMUNITY MEMBER'S HOUSEHOLD

STEP 1

Immediately contact the ISP nurse ispnurse@isparis.net in all cases.

- The Health Authorities (ARS) will also contact the school.
- ISP will contact the ARS if they have not contacted us first (for staff and students).

All community members must follow the doctor's and/or Health Authorities (ARS) requirements for isolation, quarantines and testing for the protection of both family members and the ISP community.

STEP 2

In a confirmed COVID-19 case, in collaboration with the Occupational Health Service and Health Authorities (ARS), the measures to be immediately implemented:

- Depending on the exact situation, an identification list of the person's immediate contacts is established (used for purpose of contact tracing - names, phone numbers, email and home addresses are required).
- Identification (list) the person's secondary / casual contacts.
- **Quarantine of the immediate contacts group is expected. COVID-19 testing of the immediate contacts group is expected (excepting those students under 11 years old, for which a COVID-19 PCR test is not required).**

STEP 3 (MULTIPLE ACTIONS IN PARALLEL)

Occupational Health Service and Health Authorities (ARS) will determine all steps required.

- Depending on the exact situation, **possible single class, grade level, single campus or whole school quarantines and/or closures.**
- The communication of the positive case/s. COVID-19 testing procedures and associated timelines.
- Steps, requirements and timelines for patient's return to school.
- Steps, requirements and timelines for reopening the class/grade level/campus/school.



Communication - ISP, with the assistance of the ARS, will notify any members of the ISP community, staff or students, who may have been in immediate contact.



Testing / Clearance - The ARS will confirm its requirements for every case, however, it is expected as a general rule that a test after seven days is required to 'clear' a contact person to return to school (exception for students under 11 years old).



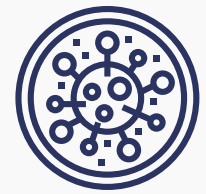
Cleaning - Any area of the school that the person occupied from the 48 hours prior to their isolation will be deep cleaned and disinfected.



Support - If and as required, psychological support services will be made available to the employee through the Occupational Doctor and at ISP for students.



CONTACT WITH A POSITIVE COVID-19 CASE

DEFINITIONS

Immediate Contact – As defined by Santé Publique France (www.santepubliquefrance.fr). Depends on situation (e.g. person(s) or not wearing masks), age of person (specifics for under 11 years old), time in contact with an infected person, distance near infected person, location, etc. A person who develops symptoms for COVID-19 is considered to be contagious from **48 hours before** developing the symptoms.

Household Cases - In case of immediate contact with an infected person who lives **in the same household** the person must be **tested immediately**.

Non-Household Cases - In non-household cases, a test must be done **7 days after the last contact with the sick person**. The exception to this is if the person begins to experience symptoms, then the test is effectuated immediately. For those students under 11 years old, a COVID-19 PCR test is not required; however, the student must remain out of school for 7 days.

You can access a COVID-19 PCR test without medical prescription.



I isolate myself at home.

(Students can register for the ISP online home learning curriculum).



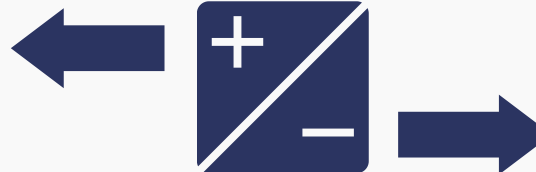
I wear a mask in the presence of other people.

I continue to isolate at home until full recovery (and full recovery for all those in my household). ARS will contact me to establish direct contact lists.



My COVID-19 test is negative

Health Insurance calls me to provide recommendations. There are specific (re)testing requirements for household cases.
