The ISP Centre for Research and Professional Development was inaugurated in 2019 following the School’s three-year experience leading action research projects, and as a natural extension of the School’s long experience delivering the inquiry-based International Baccalaureate curriculum. The Research and Development Centre aims to expand its network of research mentors in order to produce high-quality findings in research areas closely linked to the School’s strategic plan. Additionally, the Centre aims to produce a research toolkit, for use within the ISP mentor network or in any other community driven by curiosity and a strong desire to generate knowledge.

2019-20 and beyond!

The *Be the Change You Want to See* conference in June 2019 linked ISP's Strategic Plan (below) to its whole-school research questions. In addition, individual action research projects will continue to be an important part of ISP's research activities. These projects include:

- What strategies can we use to improve knowledge retention?
- How might we create a human library containing breathing books?
- How might guided free time during school hours (Big Room) impact the student experience in Grade 10?
- How might we improve Early Learners' motor skills through the SuperGym programme?

Lastly, the Research Centre Steering Committee will examine the effects of a research culture on learning and teaching in a comprehensive, multi-year study.

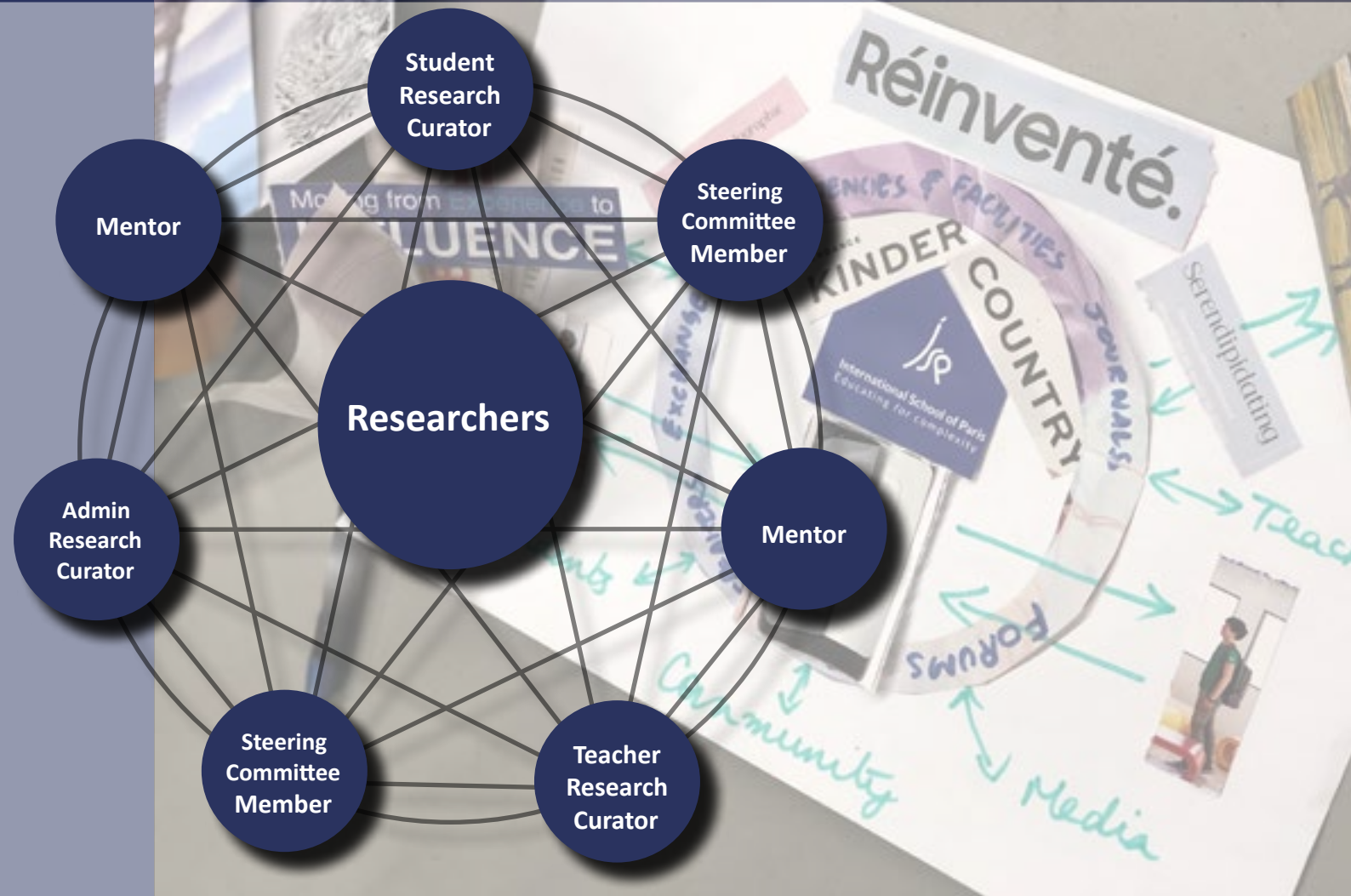

How does the Centre's structure function?
Researchers (students, staff and all other members of the ISP community) are at the centre of the ISP research network. **Mentors** assist researchers by providing necessary support, including methodological advice or assistance in presenting a research project. The **Steering Committee** sets the strategic direction and goals for the Centre in addition to providing guidance in important domains, such as ethics. **Curators** recruit and train mentors and celebrate community achievements.
